CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



In both TPC Kids and The Ark we have been reading 1 Samuel.

Here's what happens...



One night, Samuel wakes up to someone calling his name. He thinks it's Eli, the priest, but it's not. By the third time Samuel hears his name, Eli realizes it's God. Samuel listens to God's message and passes it along.

Bible Point: God speaks, so we listen for him.

Talk About This...

*What's something you'd love to hear God talk to you about?

Later in 1 Samuel, the Philistines capture the Ark of God, a holy box that represents God's presence. They put the Ark in a temple with an idol named Dagon, and Dagon keeps falling before the Ark!

This demonstrates that God is real and the idol isn't.

Bible Point: God is real, so we believe he's the one true God.

Talk About This...

*If you could make one fake thing become real, what would you choose and why?







PASTOR'S PAGE

So when I saw the Christmas displays go up at Lowe's in late September, I was surprisingly undismayed. Not because I didn't think it just another calendar push to get ahead of the competition, but because I didn't want to waste my energy on the inevitable. It's a clash of values – and when Money is at stake, the Messiah will lose every time. Well, Jesus never really loses, but the world loses out. And Jesus knew this. He let us know from the outset that the "world," (as it expresses the rebellion/indifference/ of sin against a holy, loving God) is not our friend. In his priestly prayer on the night of his arrest, and the night before his death, he prayed for his disciples – then and now – knowing that the world already hated them because like Jesus, they were now "not of this world."

In this prayer, Jesus didn't ask the Father to take them out of the world, but that he had sent them into the world, just as the Father had sent him into the world. BUT – knowing the world would be a dangerous place – he prayed two things for them:

That they would be kept ("protected") from the evil one. (John 17:15)

That they would be sanctified ("set apart") in the truth. (John 17:17)

Now there are many resources for living our lives as disciples of Jesus, but the ones Jesus prays most directly connected with in the face of the hatred of the world are these two: To be protected and kept safe from the attacks of the devil, and to be secure in the truth of the gospel. And what resources they are! As we feel increasingly alien to the agendas of secular society, and more vulnerable to the animosity of the world to religious faith (and Christianity in particular), we can know that this comes as no surprise to Jesus, and that he has already prepared us to live confidently in the midst of this. Jesus has prayed for our protection and our sanctification in the truth. We don't have to feel intimidated by those who are angry at the church – we are prepared to handle their opposition We don't have to feel threatened by arguments that we are deluded by the false and fanciful claims of the Bible. We have been entrusted with the truth.

So...back to Lowe's. On one of my many recent trips there, I ran into someone I knew who didn't go to our church (goes to another). But with all the Christmas decorations around us, and Thanksgiving just ahead of us, she made it a point to say that their family would be at our **Living Nativity** *again* this year, and how *every year* it is an important part of their Christmas. The Living Nativity is where we take the truth with which we have been given – and have been entrusted – out of the sanctuary and into the street. It's our "Minority Report" on what is really being celebrated this time of year. See you on the grass!

We call this event the *Incarnation* – that is, of God "becoming flesh" for us in the birth of Jesus. But not just '*for*' us, but '*with us*,' as in "*Emmanuel, which means 'God with us*.'" **The theme of "God with us," will be my sermon series this Advent:**

Emmanuel – God with us...

- ... in our HOPE (Dec. 1)
- ... in our PEACE (Dec. 8)
- ... in our JOY (Dec. 15)
- ... in our LOVE (Dec. 22)

... in our SALVATION (Dec. 24 - Christmas Eve)

Our Christmas Offering this year will support our ECO Partner, **World Renew**, specifically their North American Disaster Response Services (DRS). DRS provides the following services to community organizations in the days, months and years after a disaster:

- Early Assessment using trained Volunteers
- Clean-up and Debris Removal -via teams of volunteers
- Unmet Needs Assessment generally 5 to 12 months after a disaster



- Organization Capacity Building advice and guidance to local recovery groups
- Construction Estimating using trained volunteers
- Reconstruction In 2018 alone, 2,261 people volunteered to help rebuild homes.








New series: "Five Hours with the Master" 8:45am TPC Library, led by Ray Derby

It's time to order your poinsettias in memory or in honor of someone special.


