

PASTOR'S PAGE

As I write this – it's election day. I dropped off my mail-in ballot at the precinct center on my way into work and have my "I Voted" sticker stuck to my shirt. Voting is one of the great gifts and great privileges of a democratic society. And by all counts to date, this looks to be potentially the greatest turnout in recent memory. Regardless of the outcome, may this day, and the ones to follow, represent participatory democracy well. And more than that, may we remain secure and confident in the truth that is bigger than any particular outcome. I came across an article this morning on The Gospel Coalition website by Kevin DeYoung, who, among other things, is Assistant Professor of Systematic Theology at Reformed Theological Seminary. The title of the article is "What Will Still Be True When the Election Is Over," and his opening words express that sentiment better than any I was hoping to come up with:

We may know by early morning who will be president. Or we may not know until the end of the year which side will be celebrating come Inauguration Day. But whether we have hours or days or weeks left, the 2020 election season will come to an end. And when it is over—after countless tweets, posts, articles, and punditry; after being exposed to a steady stream of advertising, befuddlement, and outrage; after all the ballots have been counted, and you feel relieved, grateful, or despondent—don't forget what will still be true:

God will still be on the throne, and he will be working all things according to the counsel of his will (Eph. 1:11). God will be our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble (Ps. 46:1). God's dominion will be an everlasting dominion, and his kingdom will endure from generation to generation (Dan. 4:34).

Our God is not small, and his providential care cannot be stymied. The king's heart will be a stream of water in the hand of the Lord, and he will turn it wherever he chooses (Prov. 21:1). Not a bird will fall to the ground, or a hair from your head, apart your Father in heaven (Matt. 10:29-30).

There is no guarantee, for good or ill, regarding the future of the United States of America, but there is an unbreakable promise that Christ will build the church, and the gates of hell will not prevail against it (Matt. 16:18).

Come tomorrow, all of the promises of God will still be Yes and Amen in Christ (2 Cor. 1:20). Nothing will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Rom. 8:39). The Lord will still know those who are his (2 Tim. 2:19), and if you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ you will be saved (Acts 16:31).

And I would add to that, with regard to our particular expression of the body of Christ, that Templeton Presbyterian Church will continue to give witness to all these truths, and more. As we head into the final days of our church calendar year, and begin a new one on November 29 (the First Sunday of Advent), we are doing our very best to do what always do at this time of year – from Thanksgiving Baskets, to Operation Christmas Child, to the Angel Tree, to our Christmas Hope Offering, to the Children's Christmas Program, to The Living Nativity, to Christmas Eve – the ministry and mission of the church goes on.

After eight months of an unrelenting national crisis of health and livelihood, the coming of Advent and Christmas is a powerful reminder of God's identifying and saving presence in the world. The good news of great joy was just a baby, and it would be another 30+ years before the hope of the promise of a savior would be seen and experienced. Indeed, for years nothing outwardly changed for anyone, except Mary and Joseph. How easy for the shepherds, the wise men, and maybe even for Mary and Joseph, to wonder and question as the days and weeks and years would follow with nothing to show for the promise except a boy growing up. How easy it may have been for them to adjust to the normalcy of the human development from baby to boy to man, and not see the promise unfolding before their eyes ... to let the earlier visions and dreams and interventions fade in prominence in the midst of the demands of parenthood and the mundane routines of everyday life. And yet, the promises remained sure. Jesus never stopped being "God with us." God's purposes were fulfilled in the most unlikely of ways.

Could it be that of all the Advents and all the Christmases of the past 50 years or so, this Advent and this Christmas may be the most timely and meaningful of them all? How much we believe it, and how well we celebrate it, will give us the answer.
