PASTOR'S PAGE

As we begin Advent, the toll of the pandemic continues to surpass what most of us anticipated when it began, both in its breadth and depth – the length of time we have been in it...and the amount of disruption and damage it has created. I won't rehash studies and statistics that you have been reading elsewhere, but they are sobering.

Whatever inconveniences, adjustments, and losses we have endured as a church, pale in comparison to our nation at large, as we have been able to sustain a worshiping community in a variety of ways, thanks to the innovations of technology and the hard work and decision-making of the staff and ordained leadership, along with so many others who are volunteering to help and lead groups, studies, and ministries, as well as those who are demonstrating acts of care and love for others on an individual basis. I continue to remain grateful to God that thus far, we have (to my knowledge) no known case of Covid-19 from within our congregation, though some have had cases within their own families.

Still, we are feeling the loss of things, in whole or in part, that have been (past), and would have been (future), special events, ministries, and programs of fellowship, growth, and outreach: Palm Sunday processional, Maundy Thursday (with Living Last Supper), Easter Sunday (with all-church pancake breakfast), Vacation Bible School, TPC Kids Time on Sunday Morning, Youth Group *Meetings*, Youth *Events* (e.g. Summer Kick-off, camps, retreats, conferences, etc.), In-Person gatherings of all kinds, Carnival for Trick or Treat on Main Street, Leadership Christmas gatherings, and the Living Nativity – to name what comes right to mind. The IF Gathering may be a casualty of this season as well, after which we may start all over again with no, or limited, Lent and Easter events that are most special when shared in person with one another. And of course, the fact that our worship is still something that is experienced in geographical dislocation, is what affects us *all* to some degree, one way or another, week in and week out. Then, there are things like VBS, Living Nativity, IF, and other efforts toward outreach, which are an especially hard pill to swallow as they exemplify our tag line on our sign out front, *Connection in the Heart of Town*.

So, for me, Advent comes at a good time. Just as we're (or should I say, "I'm") taking stock of our losses and the ways we've had to adapt with a "lesser" product, wondering how much longer this will last, and how harmful the lingering effects will be, here comes Jesus, *"who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men." Philippians 2:6-7* Loss ... Dislocation ...Adaptation. And then there's Mary and Joseph. Mary certainly never expected to be a mother in that way, and as much as pregnancy and motherhood are great disrupters, hers was magnified by the manner in which it happened and the baby that would be hers. And when they left for Bethlehem, little did they know that their eventual destination would be Egypt – exiled to a foreign land for 7 years.

So this Advent, I choose to embrace the unexpected, the unplanned, the unchosen, the unwanted, the inconvenient, the disappointment, and the loss, and look for the signs of God's presence and faithfulness as he promises to lead and direct my steps ... every step of the way.

This Advent – I choose to be encouraged by the opportunity to be faithful in return – creative, obedient, and Spirit-led opportunistic – willing to adapt, adjust, and love the lesser expressions of the things we miss ... things that we can't do in exactly the same way, but things that are holy and precious nonetheless because they have God as our object of worship and of sacrifice.

This Advent – I choose to *wait*. I will wait expectantly, as long as it takes, for this pandemic to run its course, so as to be able to see the fruit of what God is doing, even now, because of it.

This Advent – I choose to trust in the efficacy of Jesus' High Priestly Prayer, and out of my identity in Christ, to root my truth, my joy, and my love in Him.

Christmas Offering 2020 – Enrich Lives, Mbale, Uganda



Our Christmas Offering this year will be in support of Kellie and James Wenzel's **ENRICH LIVES.** They have a long-term relationship with Divine Care Primary School in the Namabasa district of Mbale, Uganda. Through the past few years, **ENRICH LIVES** has been able to raise money to provide teacher's salaries, solar power and student sponsorships.

Their greatest need right now is support for students.

There are about **150** students in the school, but **70** of them can't afford to go to school right now. We would like to provide sponsorship for these **70** students. It costs about **\$10** a month for a student to go to school, so we are looking to raise about **\$6300** to cover these **70** students for their **9** months of tuition.
