
### **SPRING DEACONS QUARTERLY OFFERING**




### **STEPHEN MINISTRY TRAINING HAS BEGUN!**

## THE MEANING OF LITURGICAL COLORS

The communion table at the front of the sanctuary is covered with a tablecloth and the front of the wooden lectern has a little banner hanging from it. Have you ever noticed that the colors change occasionally? Have you ever wondered if it was just random or had a meaning behind it? I will answer that burning question! The colors are determined by the liturgical calendar. Liturgical means pertaining to liturgy. Liturgy is defined as “a form or formulary according to which public religious worship, especially Christian worship, is conducted.” The church’s year is divided into seasons which are Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, Ordinary Time, Lent, Easter, Pentecost and back to Ordinary Time. Some denominations celebrate some feast days or other sacraments. Our church typically sticks to the aforementioned calendar. Advent and Lent use the color purple which symbolize penance, preparation, sacrifice. Christmas and Easter use the color white which symbolize purity, joy, light and glory. Red is used on Pentecost Sunday symbolizing blood, and fire. Green is used during Ordinary Time which is a season focused on the three year public ministry of Jesus, His teachings and miracles. The green symbolizes hope and life. The use of liturgical colors is used by many Christian denominations with the origination attributed to the Roman Catholic church in 1198. Other Christian churches have adopted the use of liturgical colors over time with the Presbyterian church making it official in 1970 so we are newcomers to the tradition. It is a visual way to remind ourselves of the changing of the seasons in the church. It will stay on white until May 28 to celebrate Pentecost. The following day it will change to green where it will stay until December 3 when it changes to purple to begin Advent. Now you know!
