


MEMBERSHIP CLASS







Heather wrote:

"As the Director of Worship Ministries and part of the Worship team, I have prepared a list of beliefs I have for worship and what I hope to instill in those participating in our church worship services:

I agree with the Westminster Shorter Catechism, Question One, that states, "Man's chief end is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever." One of those ways of glorifying God is through music, both vocal and instrumental.

I understand that I am the Leader of Worship and will choose music that is beneficial to the congregation during Sunday services to deepen participants' understanding and love for God.

I will critically think about the sermon message and choose music that edifies the meaning of the Scripture passages read and preached upon.


I know that I am a ministry leader in the Christian faith and will reflect upon songs' lyrics and overall meaning of each song to match the pastor's message of the day.

I will continue to be an instrument for "Calling out to..." God in His temple leading all who hear to desire and have a closer relationship with Him." Proverbs 2: 3-8

I will work with a Worship team to provide beautiful music about which we have prayed together to be a worthy contribution to the service.

I will encourage others in the congregation with musical talent, both vocal and instrumental, to share their talents from time to time on the worship team."




The class is open to TPC family, friends, and community members. Participants of all ages (18+) are encouraged to attend and are advised to wear regular everyday attire.
