When was the last time you looked at the stars? One night, the outside light at my place was out, and as I fumbled to find the right key in the darkness outside my apartment, I happened to look up. Through the trees, I saw the stars and it hit me. I was so busy trying to get inside

that I hadn't taken the time to simply look at them since I moved.

The Bible mentions stars in several passages. Maybe the verse that comes to mind for you is Psalm 8:3-4: "When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for them?"

Or perhaps it's a verse like Philippians 2:15, which inspires us with a new way of life in Christ: "... Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky " Both are amazing reminders of God's creativity in nature and of what it looks like to follow Him in a dark world.

But the passage that came to my mind was Genesis 15:5: "He took him [Abraham] outside and said, 'Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your offspring be.""

God promised Abraham that his descendants would be like the stars. What an incredible promise! Looking back, we see how God fulfilled it: from Abraham, God created a nation. Yet we often gloss over the fact that this promise was given to a man and his wife at what seemed like a hopeless point in their lives. They had no children, and by human standards there was no way to fix it. Here we see God taking Abraham on a "nature tour" to give him a glimpse of what His promise would look like.

I wonder how many times, in the 25 years that followed before the promise was fulfilled, Abraham looked up at those same stars and thought: Did I just imagine God said that? It's been 5, 10, 15, 20 years. Maybe God has forgotten about Sarah and me.

This summer, I got to teach this lesson to 70 kids in grades K-8. I handed out glow-in-the-dark stars, like the ones that once covered my childhood bedroom ceiling. The big idea for them and for us, is this: When God promises, God will provide.

I don't know what promises you've been waiting on this past week, month, or year. I'm here to remind you: God has not forgotten. He doesn't accidentally fail to follow through the way we humans sometimes do.

So the next time you look at the stars, remember: When God promises, God will provide.


